## THE PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

2013 began with news that two more landmarks of the second half of twentieth century Houston are soon to be razed, joining lost icons such as the Shamrock and the Prudential Building. Foley's Department Store on Main Street set a new national standard for merchandizing when it opened in 1948. It's architecture, inside and out, was innovative, and for years it was one of the most profitable department stores in the United States. At Thanksgiving Foley's sponsored Houston's Thanksgiving Day Parade which ushered in the Christmas season. Houstonians flocked to see its Christmas window displays which were the centerpiece of the holiday decorations in downtown Houston. As I write, the liquidation sale is under way in anticipation of the store's closing.

Today I attended the auction of the furnishings of the one hundred and nineteen year old Houston Club. Since 1955, the Houston Club Building, which soon will be razed, has been at the center of activity for Houston business, social organizations and the arts. For most of the twentieth century, most people who were active in building Houston either belonged to the Houston Club or attended functions there. The club will continue in another location, but the culture which it built at its iconic location on Rusk Avenue will be relegated to historical photographs and documents and to its history book.

Although the beautiful white marble Sakowitz Department Store across from Foley's on Main Street has not been razed, it has been gutted and transformed into a multistory parking garage. These three icons of mid twentieth century Houston life join many other buildings and organizations whose histories for the most part are kept alive only at the Houston Metropolitan Research Center. These buildings were integral parts of many of our lives over many years. As time goes on, more of the built environment which we associate with the soul of Houston, such as the Astrodome, will disappear. For this reason, we work to support the institution which houses our collective memory, the Houston Metropolitan Research Center.

I hope you will join me on Monday, January 28 to hear Stephen Fox's talk on Houston architecture.

## MINUTES OF THE October 29th ANNUAL MEETING

The meeting was called to order by President Dorothy Knox Houghton at 7:05 p.m. Minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

Treasurer Cathy Fitch reported that as of September 10, 2012, total funds were \$39,894.25 comprised of \$12,662.36 in the checking account, \$6,231.89 in the savings account and \$21,000 in a certificate of deposit. She also reported that as of November 1<sup>st</sup>, 2012, PayPal will be operational on the Friends of the Texas Room Web site for paying for memberships or to purchase the DVDs.

President Houghton announced the following membership benefits that will be offered by library staff: preservation-consultation days and research lock-ins twice a year, with advance sign-up. Members also may purchase up to five photographs at half-price each year.

## NEWS FROM THE TEXAS ROOM

The HMRC staff is continuing work on various projects to improve our services and outreach efforts to our customers and the general community.

- The Collection Analysis project is ongoing. Since the last *Dispatch*, Emily Scott, HMRC Archivist, and three volunteers have reviewed 254 archival collections. This review included creating physical descriptions, scope and content notes, and biographical notes for each collection. Most of these collections had not been previously described.
- Vernon Gillette, Friends of the Texas Room member, has joined the team of staff members developing lesson plans for K-12 teachers incorporating HMRC

primary sources. The lessons will vary in length and will cover various subject areas.

- Aaron Winslow, Electronic Services Librarian, is still working on combining all of our many photo databases. Many of these photo databases were developed by Friends of the Texas Room Volunteers. The end result will be a web-based site that will include records for almost 150,000 photographs.
- Laney Dwyer, Architectural Archivist, is still working through a complete inventory of our entire architectural drawing collection. She is going job by job to ensure accuracy in our online database. The end result will be an online database with several hundred more records that accurately describes all of our architectural drawings.

## Emma Richardson Cherry: Houston's First Modern Artist

## February 1, 2013 – May 4, 2013

## Julia Ideson Building | 500 McKinney St., 77002

The exhibition will be a retrospective of Mrs. Cherry's work and will include 50 plus works by the artists and a selected group of works by her contemporaries, some of Houston's first artist in the 20<sup>th</sup> century, and following generations to discuss the impact of the artist's work. This exhibition will also include archival material drawn from local collections. Emma Richardson Cherry, one of the earliest professional women artists in Houston, worked in oils, watercolors, pastels, pencil, and charcoal; though at least one critic referred to her use of "modern" laws of color," she painted a number of traditional

portraits while living in Houston and experimented with a number of styles. She taught locally in her studio, and in 1900 she organized the Houston Public School Art League, which later became the Houston Museum of Fine Arts.

## Digital Film Collection (KHOU-TV and Orris Brown)

Most of these films are from HMRC's KHOU-TV Collection, and the others are from the Orris Brown Film Collection. The digital preservation of these films was made possible by a grant to the Texas Archive of the Moving Image and the Houston Public Library from the Texas State Library and Archives Commission and the U.S. Institute of Museum and Library Services.

## POLICIES

## Policies of the Friends of the Texas Room

Relating to The Houston Metropolitan Research Center which includes the Collections of the Archives and Manuscripts Department, the Texas and Local History Department, and the Special Collections Department of the Houston Public Library

### A. Contributions

From time to time, the Friends of the Texas Room will purchase and contribute to the Houston Metropolitan Research Center of the Houston Public Library items that will enrich and enhance the above-named collections and ensure their preservation.

All such contributions will be purchased by the Friends directly and then given to the Library with specific stipulations as to how such contributions are to be used by the Library to enhance and ensure the preservation of the HMRC collections.

The Friends will give no money directly to the Library.

The Friends will not buy expendable supplies for the Library.

The Friends will not fund Library personnel.

### B. Relationship to Administration and Staff

The Friends of the Texas Room is not to be involved in the administrative or employee actions of the Center, except that the Friends can question policies which, in its opinion, negatively impact the ability of the Center to provide service to the public.

### **CULTURAL MATCHING GIFTS**
