NEWS FROM THE TEXAS ROOM

National Preparedness Month (NPM), recognized each September, provides an opportunity to remind us that we all must prepare ourselves and our families now and throughout the year. This NPM will focus on planning, with an overarching theme: **Disasters Happen. Prepare Now. Learn How.**

Take time to learn lifesaving skills – such as CPR and first aid, check your insurance policies and coverage for the hazards you may face, such as flooding and wind damage. Make sure to consider the costs associated with disasters and save for an emergency. Also, know how to take



practical safety steps like shutting off water and gas.

Disasters can strike quickly and without warning, rendering even the most prepared of us feeling helpless. NPM also falls in the middle of hurricane season, which is a great time for Houstonians to think about and prepare for what to do in case of an emergency.

PREPARATION

Track the storm via the [National Hurricane Center](#).

Make sure your insurance and disaster recovery vendor contact information is readily available.

Back up electronic records and store the back-ups off-site or in the cloud.

Secure outdoor furniture, bike racks, book drops, signage, etc. – anything that can become a projectile in strong winds.

Move important documents and heirlooms that are in areas vulnerable to flooding (i.e., the floor, lower levels of your house) or susceptible to rain (near windows or under roofs) out of harm's way.

If you have time, cut lengths of plastic sheeting to be able to throw them over shelves, cabinets, or equipment should the building envelope be compromised.

Review individual or family plans.

RECOVERY

Keep this 24/7 hotline number handy: 202.661.8068. The [National Heritage Responders](#), a team of trained conservators and collections care professionals administered by the Foundation of the American Institute for Conservation, are available 24/7 to provide advice.

Download the [FEMA mobile app](#) for disaster resources, weather alerts, and safety tips. The app (available in English and Spanish) provides a customizable checklist of emergency supplies, maps of open shelters and recovery centers, disaster survival tips, and weather alerts from the National Weather Service. The app also enables users to receive push notifications reminding them to take important steps to prepare their homes and families for disasters.

FRIENDS OF THE TEXAS ROOM POLICIES

The FTxR policies relate to the Houston Metropolitan Research Center which includes the Collections of the Archives and Manuscripts Department, the Texas and Local History Department, and the Special Collections Department of the Houston Public Library.

A. Contributions

From time to time, the Friends of the Texas Room will purchase and contribute to the Houston Metropolitan Research Center of the Houston Public Library items that will enrich and enhance the above-named collections and ensure their preservation.

All such contributions will be purchased by the Friends directly and then given to the Library with specific stipulations as to how such contributions are to be used by the Library to enhance and ensure the preservation of the HMRC collections.

The Friends will give no money directly to the Library.

The Friends will not buy expendable supplies for the Library.

The Friends will not fund Library personnel.

B. Relationship to Administration and Staff

The Friends of the Texas Room is not to be involved in the administrative or employee actions of the Center, except that the Friends can question policies which, in its opinion, negatively impact the ability of the Center to provide service to the public.
